

(2) If a language board is satisfied as to the ability of an applicant under subparagraph (1) of this paragraph the chairman of the board shall issue to such applicant a certificate of proficiency accordingly.

5. (1) The Supervisor of Elections shall appoint one or more language appeals boards to hear appeals under this paragraph.

(2) Any person who has been refused a certificate of proficiency by a language board may, within three days of such refusal, appeal in writing to a language appeals board which shall give such person notice of the place and the time, which shall be the earliest time possible, at which the appeal will be heard.

(3) A language appeals board may either allow an appeal, whereupon it shall itself issue a certificate of proficiency to the appellant, or may reject the appeal, and in either case the decision of a language appeals board shall be final.
