THE TRANSFER AND DELEGATION OF POWERS ORDINANCE, 1955

(No. 31 of 1955)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Transfer and Delegation of Powers Ordinance, 1955, the Governor, with the approval of the Legislative Council, has been pleased to make the following Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Transfer of Powers (Minister for Legal Affairs) (No. 1) Order, 1956.
- 2. The exercise of the powers or the performance of the duties described in the fourth column of the Schedule to this Order being powers and duties conferred upon or vested in the Governor by the provisions of the Ordinances specified in the first, second and third columns of the said Schedule is hereby transferred to the Minister for Legal Affairs, and, for the purpose of carrying such transfer into effect, the consequential amendments set forth in the fifth column of the said Schedule shall be made to the Ordinances mentioned therein.
