- 4. In all cases civil and criminal to which Africans are parties every Court--
  - (a) shall be guided by African customary law so far as it is applicable and is not repugnant to justice and morality or inconsistent with the Order in Council or any written law; and
  - (h) shall decide all such cases according to substantial justice without undue regard to technicalities or procedure and without undue delay.
- 5. All proceedings commenced or pending immediately before the appointed day before the former Supreme Court may be continued and conducted before the Supreme Court, subject to such modifications as are necessitated by the coming into operation of the Constitution of Kenya.
- 6. Any judgment given by the former Supreme Court which immediately before the appointed day had not been fully executed or enforced may be executed and enforced in the same manner as if it were a judgment of the Supreme Court.
- 7. In respect of any judgment given before the appointed day by the former Supreme Court an appeal to the Court of Appeal may be commenced, continued and concluded, or continued and concluded (as the case may be), as if it were a judgment given by the Supreme Court:

Provided that no appeal shall lie to the Court of Appeal from any final decision or any part of any final decision where there was a right of appeal under section 64E of the Kenya (Constitution) Order in Council, 1958, as amended.

#### THE KENYA ORDER IN COUNCIL 1963

(L.N. 245 of 1963)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Kenya Order in Council 1963, and of all other powers thereunto enabling him, the Governor hereby makes the following Regulations:—

# THE KENYA (AMENDMENT OF LAWS) (PROMISSORY OATHS) REGULATIONS, 1963

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Kenya (Amendment of Laws) (Promissory Oaths) Regulations, 1963, and shall come into operation on the day appointed under section 1 (2) of the Kenya Order in Council 1963.

2. There shall be substituted for the First and Second Schedules to the Promissory Oaths Ordinance two new Schedules as follows:—

So help me God.
4. Oath of Secretary to the Cahinet
I, being called upon to exercise the functions of Secretary to the Cabinet in Kenya, do swear that, except with the authority of the Governor or the Prime Minister, I will not directly or indirectly reveal the business or proceedings of the Cabinet, or the nature or contents of any document communicated to me as Secretary to the Cabinet or any matter coming to my knowledge in my capacity as Secretary to the Cabinet. So help me God.
