THE COLONIAL AIR NAVIGATION ORDER, 1961

THE COLONIAL AIR NAVIGATION (EXEMPTION) (No. 21) AUTHORITY, 1963

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by Articles 79 and 80 of the Colonial Air Navigation Order, 1961, the East African Common Services Authority hereby grants the following Authority:—

L.N. 15 of 1962.

1. This Authority may be cited as the Colonial Air Navigation (Exemption) (No. 21) Authority, 1963, and shall remain in force for the day of the 5th January, 1964, only.

Title.

2. Competitors participating in the Air Rally organized by the Mombasa Flying Club at Mombasa Airport, Kenya, are hereby exempted from the provisions of paragraph (2) of Article 32 of the Colonial Air Navigation Order. 1961. in so far as such provisions would preclude the said competitors from dropping any article, whether or not attached to a parachute, from aircraft, subject to the following conditions namely—

Exemption.

- (a) the articles to be dropped shall consist of light paper bags containing not more than sixteen ounces of harmless white powder;
- (b) the height above ground level from which the paper bags may be dropped, shall be not less than 200 feet, or more than 500 feet;
- (c) the point to which the paper bags may be dropped shall be on the Mombasa Airport on a specially marked area adjacent to runway 09/27, opposite to the Shell Fuel Depot, not less than 300 yards from any part of the area reserved for spectators or from any building or from any aircraft on the ground;
- (d) the paper bags shall not be dropped whilst the aircraft is flying towards, or away from the area reserved for spectators or any aircraft on the ground or any buildings:
- (e) the competitors who may drop the paper bags shall be approved for the purpose, by the organizers of the Air Rally:
- (f) any special instructions which may be given in the interests of safety by the Air Traffic Control Officer appointed by the Director of Civil Aviation to control flying at Mombasa Airport shall be strictly complied with at all times.
