An Act of Parliament to make minor amendments to the statute law

1. This Act may be cited as the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Act, 1973.

The Patents Registration Act (Cap. 508).

(3) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions of this section, it is hereby expressly declared that, for the purposes of those provisions, "the law relating to patents for the time being in force in the United Kingdom relating to patents" shall include sections 46, 47 and 48 of the Patents Act, 1949, and subsection (1) (but not subsection (2)) of section 59 of the Health Services and Public Health Act, 1968, both being Acts of the United Kingdom Parliament, and in the application thereof to Kenya. references to a Secretary of State shall be construed as references to the Minister for the time being responsible for matters

relating to health.
